

## THE ESTABLISHMENT OF THE EASTERN REEF REGIONAL CENTRE

## THE CHALLENGE / BACKGROUND

- Ever increasing number of church members
- Lack of adequate venue capacity to cater for our regional meetings such as Quarters, Seminars, Conventions, Rallies, etc.
- Exorbitant rental costs of external facilities
- Consolidation of regional offices into one office block to accommodate all the structures or segments including: DCC, Mothers, Men, Sisters, Youth, Sunday School and other Sub-Committees
- Reliance on a single mode of fund raising which may not be sustainable for the future



## THE SOLUTION

- All structures or segments of the Region to consolidate their financial efforts (DC, Mothers, Men, Sisters, Youth and Sunday School)
- Construct and establish a state of the art modern Regional Centre facility that will address all the challenges outlined

## THE REGIONAL CENTRE OBJECTIVES

- To be self sufficient, sustainable and profitable
- To address the ongoing need of accommodating our ever-increasing membership and attendance at all group levels during Regional events such as Quarterly Meetings, Rallies, Mini Conventions, Seminars, Committee Meetings, etc.
- To provide Regional office administrative capacity and facilities

# THE REGIONAL CENTRE OBJECTIVES (cont...)

- To be a catalyst for job creation and support for small business opportunities within the Movement, in particular within the Region
- To serve as a strategic income source for Regional activities across all segments or groups
- To reposition the Region economically to allow it to play an influential role in the regional economy
- To provide capacity for social responsibility or outreach to the surrounding communities



## THE BUSINESS MODEL (TBM)

The Regional Centre shall take the form of a Conference or Convention Centre Business Model

## LOCATION OF THE CENTRE

- Committee decided that in light of the business model:
  - Kempton Park / Midrand / Centurion areas are ideal as are located in the main business nodes
  - Central to the Region
  - Surrounding locals could be used for support such as Thembisa, Sivana, Ebony, Phomolong, Alex, lvory, etc.

## TBM: THE REGIONAL CENTRE FACILITY

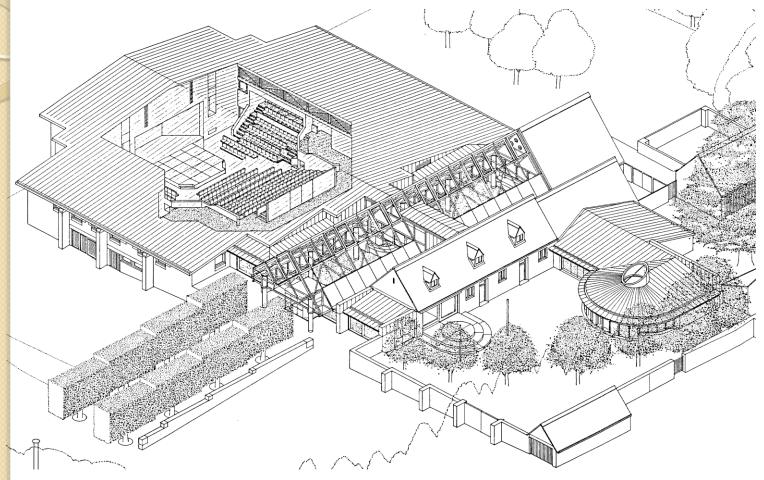
- I0 Conference Rooms and Board-rooms with the capacity to accommodate a range of I0 to 300 people.
- An Auditorium with the capacity to seat at least 5000 people
- A Reception block
- Canteen Facility (Kitchen / Dining)
- Decent dometries / accommodation facility to accommodate a minimum of 500 people

All the rooms, kitchen and the auditorium to be equipped with the state of the art communication system and conferencing equipment

## STRATEGIC SNAPSHOT

- Build 10,000 sqm under cover facility
- Would require about R90m
- Build in 5 years time (deliver by Dec 2015)
- Building to be Self funded (by church members in the Region)
- Consider other alternative sources of funding such as:
  - Structural Funding (Men, Youth, Sisters and Mothers)
  - Percentage contribution by Locals
  - Investments
  - External Donations
  - Bridging Financing

## FUNDING MODEL

- Use individual member contributions
- Member statistics (Averages)
  - 26 Small locals x 77 = 2,000
  - I5 Medium locals x 300 = 4,500
  - I 3 Big locals x 500 = 6,500
  - TOTAL of 13,000
- To achieve R90m, each member to contribute R7000 per 5 year period
- This translate to RI400 per year
- This translates to RII7 per month
- This translates to R29 per week
- This translates to R4 per day

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## MEMBER CONTRIBUTION PROCESS

- STEP I:
  - Contributor completes deposit
    - Reference to be correct
- STEP 2:
  - Contributor makes deposit or EFT or D/order
- STEP 3:
  - Contributor submits proof of deposit to Local Coordinator
- STEP 4:
  - Coordinator submits proof of deposits to office

## MEMBER CONTRIBUTION PROCESS

- (cont...)
- STEP 5:
  - Office captures the deposits on the System

### • STEP 6:

 Office reconciles deposits submitted with the bank statement

### • STEP 7:

 Office sends individual statements to members or contributors
